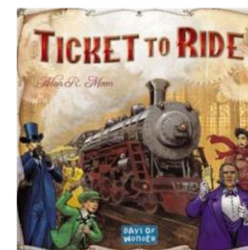

Pett Parish Council Update

The parish meeting took place as planned. Councillor Keith Glazier gave a very helpful presentation on the government's plans for devolution and local government reorganisation, together with how it may all work out. Exactly how it will work out and, in particular, how it will affect parish councils and, indeed, the individual elector is still very unclear. The government were to have published a White Paper giving more detail, but apparently are reconsidering this aspect. At present, it almost looks as though there will be no level of local government between the unitary body (effectively a reconstituted county council) and parish and town councils, an arrangement that doesn't seem to me to be very practical. However, we shall see.

Following Keith's talk, I gave a report on the year past. Then, following my prior invitation, there were reports from many of the village organizations, from the church to Seaside Stitches, and pole dancing. It was good to see that there are so many active groups in the parish with a wide range of interests. The slides from Keith's talk and my report, plus some of the village organisation's reports will be put up on Pettnet and may be there by the time you receive this issue of the parish news.

There was also a brief council meeting before the parish meeting at which it was agreed to support the Rescue Boat's planning application to extend the boathouse, so that it will be possible to have two boats launch-ready at any time.

As I have reported previously, Rother District Council has agreed to lease the Pett Level Toilets to the parish council and the formalities are going through. The district council has also agreed that the toilets can be opened before this. There has been a slight delay caused by checking that the toilets are free of legionnaire's disease and by handing over the keys, so that, as I write, the toilets are still closed, but I am very hopeful that they will be open by the time you read this report.

A work party has been set up to clear the drainage channel around the tennis court and, following that, the moss on the court will be cleared, so that, again, by the time you read this, the court should be playable. Many thanks to those who have put themselves forward to help with this.

I have reported at different times on developments related to the flooding at Pett Level. I have been asked to draw your attention to a meeting to be held on 6 June at the village hall, at which the current position regarding various approaches will be presented. Representatives from the various bodies involved (Environment Agency, County Council, Southern Water, the Future Landscapes Trust etc.) will be invited and it would be good to see a good turn-out from parishioners. In this connection, I am told that the pumps near the bottom of Chick Hill have been removed for servicing, to be reinstalled in September. Everyone hopes that there will not be a major rainstorm before then.

Two other projects are in progress. The connector between two of the ropes on the climbing tower in the playground has broken and is being replaced. I have been assured that, in the meantime, the tower is still safe. The other project concerns the parish notice board at the village hall; the doors are difficult to open and the Perspex windows are hard to see through. A test to see if adding a clear sheet to the windows will improve their transparency was successful and so sheets will be added to cover the whole windows. Work is also being carried out in an attempt to make the doors easier to open.

Finally, I have to report the death of Yvonne Hayward, who has lived in the village for many years. Our sympathy goes to her family.

ST MARY & ST PETER CHURCH

By the time you read this you may have noticed, on your walk or drive past the Church, that work has started on the renovations and repairs, in the most part thanks to your generosity, and some grants from funding organisations.

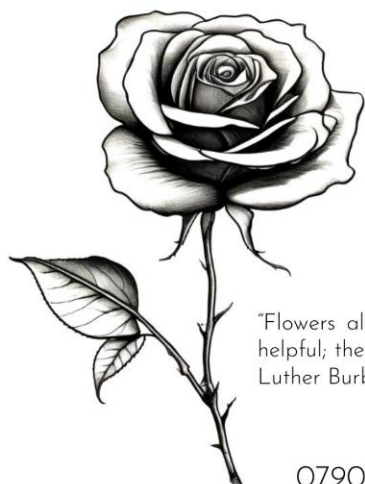
The work, costing over £35,000, will take about eight weeks to complete and during that time the church will be closed to the public for health and safety reasons. The 1980s lighting will be replaced with modern LED lighting, which is more economical and easier to maintain. The end wall, to the west of the Tower, which is battered by wind and rain, will be weatherproofed and redecorated, as will part of the Nave. Naturally the closure will mean a further loss of revenue but St Nicholas' Church on Pett Level will be open for services - the dates and time shown elsewhere in this edition.

In addition to the renovations, the Parochial Church Council has recently been legally obliged to have the Quinquennial Report on the overall state of the building carried out by the church architect. As the name suggests, this happens every five years and costs over £1,000, just for the report itself. Sadly, the Report has identified some damp in the Church Tower, caused by blocked drains, plus the need to have guano (or bird poo, as we like to call it) removed from the Tower. Obviously, this will involve expensive scaffolding and a specialist firm of guano-removers (yes, there are such companies!) as guano is toxic.

And so it goes on.... Is it worth it? Yes, if you want to maintain a church presence, whatever that means to you, in the village. Recently a lovely sunny Spring wedding was held in the church. It meant a lot to the bride to hold the ceremony there because her father is buried in the surrounding graveyard. There are requests for christenings and the interment of relatives' ashes. Other visitors to the village visit the church to look for their ancestors' graves, or just for quiet contemplation. The Easter and Christmas and Remembrance Day Services are well-attended, so the church does mean something to individuals. All contributions help to maintain the building, be it monthly or annually. If you wish to become a Friend of Pett Churches please contact me, 07977 100 296 or pettchurchtreasurer@gmail.com. If you are eligible to Gift Aid your donation, even better, as that adds another 20% to your contribution.

This report is not all gloom and doom - it is hoped that a very special fundraising event will take place in July. Priority booking will be given to those individuals who make regular monthly or annual contributions to the Church or who support the Church in other ways. Watch this space in the June issue!

Out on shouts (and BBC coverage)

At 01:50am on 3 April we were tasked to two young male casualties who had become lost and in difficulty after setting out for a late-night adventure. The casualties were located using What Three Words and the lads used their phone torches to indicate their position. 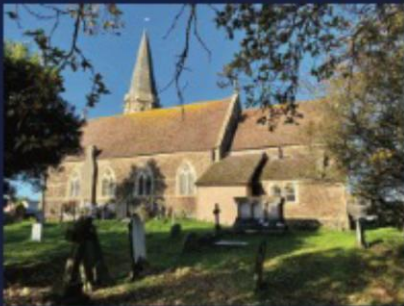

Nature Notes

When talking about the natural world, you may often hear people say things like - 'mayflies only live for a day' or 'dragonflies only live for a few weeks', etc. This is, of course, nonsense, because it ignores the time that the animal has spent as a larva, nymph or pupa. What we mean when we are talking about the lifespan of an insect, is the time it spends as an adult i.e. the time it spends looking for a mate, laying eggs, or nesting. A mayfly, for example, starts life as an egg. The egg typically takes about 2 weeks to hatch into a nymph though it may take longer if conditions are not favourable for hatching. The nymph feeds and grows and sheds its outer skeleton several times to accommodate that growth and then emerges as an adult about one year later. The adults then mate and die. (They have no mouthparts so cannot feed, unlike say, dragonflies which can feed and so extend the period they spend finding a mate and laying eggs.)



Though the one-year cycle of mayflies is typical for most insects, some, like dragonflies may spend two or more years as a nymph if conditions aren't right for emergence. Some beetles, especially those whose larvae live underground or inside wood may also live for more than a year. One example that you will soon be seeing is the Cockchafer, or May Bug, the larvae of which will stay underground for a year or two chomping the roots of your favourite plants until sufficiently sated and a warm May comes along.

When it comes to larger animals like birds, reptiles, and mammals, then there is much more variation in their lifespan. Small birds such as Bluetits may live for about 4 years, though because the mortality of chicks is high, the average lifespan is nearer one year. Larger birds such as parrots and albatrosses may live for 70 years or more. Most animals live longer in captivity, though why you'd want to do that, outside of scientific research or species conservation, is beyond me. Reptiles, of course, hold the record for longevity with species like the giant tortoises of the Galapagos Islands. Estimates of the age of giant tortoises vary wildly (mainly because their lifespan is generally longer than that of humans) but Lonesome George (the last of his subspecies) from the Galapagos was known to be about 107 when he died and the oldest recorded giant tortoise was a Seychelles Giant Tortoise at 255 years old.

Mammals have a similar range of lifespans to the reptiles. The mammal with the shortest lifespan is thought to be the weasel (though that may be a UK-centric view) with a gestation period of about 5 weeks and typically 2 or 3 years after birth. (Yes, most of us are about 9 months older than we think). The longest living mammal is not the elephant, nor even the Blue Whale, it is the Bowhead Whale at around 200 years. (Some estimates put the Greenland Shark at the top of the list with a lifespan of 300 to 500 years but proving that is problematic.) There are many contenders for the longest living organism on earth, but plants are up there, and the oldest tree is thought to be the Great Basin Bristle Cone Pine in California at 4856 years old (proved by taking an annual ring sample). Nearer to home is the Llangernyw Yew in North Wales estimated to be between 4000 and 5000 years old.

I don't know why I'm sat here writing about lifespans when Spring is happening at a tremendous rate outside. Maybe I'll catch up next month!

Cuckoo: sound of spring

It's become a tradition of mine to go camping locally for a few nights in May. Being immersed in nature, spending evenings by firelight, and absorbing the abundant buzz of wildlife; it's a good-for-the-soul time to be outdoors in Sussex.



Hawthorn, or the May tree, is flowering in fragrant blooms. Bats are flitting en-masse from maternity roosts at dusk to forage. Badgers are on the trundle and Foxes on the trot. And yes, there are loads of lovely baby bunnies. In Sussex, we are lucky to retain a population of visiting Nightingales, and on uninterrupted May nights the males are in full rattling, palpitating symphony. Tawny Owls ke-wik and Barn Owls shriek. Woodlands burst into carpets of indigo as Bluebell scent fills the understorey.

Amidst this, an undulating 'beep-boop' can be heard, a natural metronome. It is one of our most recognisable bird calls, and the onomatopoeic sound of spring and summer; the Cuckoo. Arriving from Africa in March, Cuckoos infamously lay their eggs in other birds' nests, sneakily replacing an egg of an unsuspecting parent for them to incubate, feed and fledge. The not-so-little Cuckoo nestling shunts other eggs, and even youngsters, out of the nest, outcompeting any remaining for resources, becoming the last chunky chick standing. Regularly hoodwinked are Reed Warblers, Dunnocks and Meadow Pipits.

Mostly insectivorous, with a penchant for Hairy Caterpillars, adult Cuckoos spend their days feeding prior to their homeward migration. Having not had chicks to rear and fledge, they leave around June, with the new generation following later in summer.

Overall, it sounds like Cuckoos are having a pretty easy time of it. However, as is the story of so many of our native species, they are under threat. Cuckoos have declined by 65% since the 1980s and are now on the UK conservation Red List. The usual suspects are at play of habitat loss, climate change, and pesticide use resulting in food scarcity. Additionally, these issues have befallen many of their host species, leading to similar population declines, or, at the least, Cuckoo-bewildering behaviour changes such as earlier breeding.

Despite their size and familiarity, these elusive birds are not an easy spot. In a second act of mistaken identity, their barred chest can often resemble that of a Sparrowhawk. Although their calming calls have accompanied many a spring sunderer for me, I'm still yet to see one myself. Perhaps this year could be my year. Maybe.

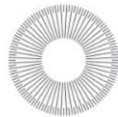

La Cucina di Angela

Pasta and Potato with Monk's Provola

This dish is called "provola del monaco" although provola subsequently became mozzarella for cooking (harder than fresh mozzarella used in salads and pizza). This recipe is one of the most famous dishes of the Neapolitan cuisine. Its origin dates to the 18th century, and precisely to 1773. The people transporting cheese in the open market were usually called the monks - hence monaco.

Since 1600, potatoes were abundant in the South of Italy (reason why this dish quickly became popular). In my family we used to cook it quite often, even though my father was not particularly keen on it due to his bad memories of the second world war, where potatoes were often (meaning always) one of the main ingredients present on the table.

(For four people)

- 350g of small pasta (break the spaghetti in small pieces if don't find any at the supermarket)
- 400g potatoes
- 1 white onion (100-150g)
- 100-150g pancetta cubes
- 20g tomato puree
- 4 tablespoons of grated parmesan
- A clove of garlic
- 10-15 leaves of fresh basil
- 100g cooking mozzarella (look for Galbani Cucina Italian Mozzarella in the supermarket)
- Extra virgin olive oil
- Salt and pepper.
- 1 litre of water

Bring the water to boil and set aside.

In a frying pan heat the olive oil and the finely chopped onions until soft. Add the pancetta cubes, the potato cut into small pieces (approx an inch) and stir for two minutes to coat them. At this point add the tomato puree and half a litre of the boiled water. Stir gently to bring the water back to boil, then add the pasta. Cook the pasta according to the instructions on the packet. 3-4 minutes before the end of the pasta cooking time add the cheese and the rest of the boiled water. Carry on stirring until the water has evaporated and all becomes creamy.

Season with salt and pepper, the basil leaves, dust with parmesan and serve it quickly.

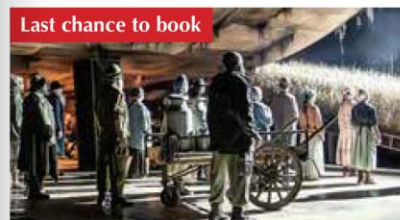
